HE TOWN OF OTIS, Berkshire County, was established February 27, 1773, as "Loudun" from a tract of common land called "Tyringham Equivalent."

June 19, 1809, Loudon and the District of Bethlehem were united as the town of Loudon. (June 24, 1789, the District of Bethlehem had been established from the North Eleven Thousand Acres.)

March 1, 1810, the Act of June 19, 1809, went into effect, and a part of Loudon (Bethlehem District) was annexed to Becket. June 13, 1810, the name of Loudon was changed to Otis.

April 9, 1838, a part of the common lands called East Eleven Thousand Acres was annexed to Otis.
