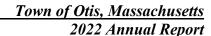

Annual Report of the Otis Select Board 2022

The Board started the year with the task of finding a new Chief of Police. An opportunity arose to share a Chief with the Town of Becket. After nailing down a few logistics and an initial interview, it was clear that this had the potential to be an excellent fit for the Town. The Board appointed Kris McDonough, Becket's Chief, in February. Under his leadership, the department structure was reinforced with a full time Sergeant and full time officer. We welcomed Tammy Weidhaas as Sergeant and our part time officer Miguel Santana was made full time. Both are experienced and dedicated officers. Kris bolstered our list of part time reserve officers and continues to oversee the mandatory bridge training of our part time trained officers. The community has reported overwhelming praise and support of the Chief and officers.

Larry Southard was re-elected to another term on the Board at the Annual Town Election in May. The members met regularly throughout the year and worked long hours striving for consistency and improved operations with each and every decision. The budget continues to be modest and the Town's financial position is strong. Otis consistently has one of the lowest tax rates in the State. In addition to our annual Chapter 90 money for roads we were awarded \$139,767 in Winter Recovery funds for roads, a Mass Works grant for \$650,000 for the Reservoir Road culvert replacement project, a feasibility study grant for \$25,000 and a Community Compact grant to upgrade software for \$20,000. The Historic Commission was awarded \$100,000 from the Mass Historic Commission grant for the former St. Paul's church building restoration work.

Some key topics throughout the year were closing Harmony Hall, speeding and increased attendance at the Town Beach, downsizing the Recreation Department; staffing discussions with Otis Rescue Squad, work at the East Otis Schoolhouse and beginning restoration at St. Paul's funded by Otis Preservation Trust. The personnel policy was updated along with interviews to support hiring at the Highway Department and Assessors Office. We welcomed Candy Chaffee as the Assessor's Clerk, Bob Navin as Highway Foreman and Jeremy Tousey on the Highway crew.

We wish to convey our appreciation to all the volunteers that continue to make Otis the special place it is. From everyone helping at the food pantry, working with the seniors in the COA, to the first responders at the Fire, Police and Rescue Squad that keep us safe. Thank you for your dedication to the community.

Otis Fire Department 2022 Annual Report

In 2022 the Otis Fire Department responded to a total of 178 calls. These calls ranged from medical calls, motor vehicle accidents/fires, carbon monoxide calls, brush fires & structure fires both in town and assisting our mutual aid towns. Our department is made up of a great group of men and women who are always willing to go the extra mile to do their job, which in turn makes my job as chief a lot easier and helps to keep our community safe in the event of an emergency. I think I speak for the members and myself when I say we couldn't do what we do without the support of our families, who make sacrifices alongside of us, which allows us to do what we do for the community.

I would like to thank the townspeople for their continued support as this year we were able to purchase two new chimney firefighting systems which will allow us to better serve the community in the event of a chimney fire. The department was able to purchase new gas meters to read CO levels in homes, we were able to purchase one for each piece of apparatus. We were able to finish outfitting the rest of our members with brush firefighting gear complete with jacket, pants, helmets & gloves. Due to supply demands and setbacks on the fabricators end we are still awaiting the delivery of our new Engine 2, we are hoping to take delivery by summer 2023.

The fire department would like to thank the townspeople, Otis Highway Dept., Otis Building Dept, Maintenance Dept., Select Board, Town Administrator, Otis Rescue Squad, Otis Police Dept. and all of the businesses for your continued support.

We look forward to seeing everyone at our annual steak roast in August.

Otis Police Department 2022 Annual Report

The 2022 yearly breakdown of the Police Department shows 39 criminal offenses have been logged since January 2022. These offenses have either been cleared by arrest, a criminal application, or the case remains open and under investigation. Officers also responded to 19 motor vehicle accidents for the year. In addition to the activity breakdown, officers also issued 84 citations for civil motor vehicle violations, criminal motor vehicle violations, arrest motor vehicle violations, and written warnings. The Police Department now has coverage for the Town from 7:00a.m. To 11:00p.m throughout the year. Having patrol coverage helps increase public safety and deter criminal activity.

All of the officers in the department continue to be proactive and reactive while serving the Town. Each individual officer carries unique skills and qualities that help the department provide the highest level of service to the Town.

I want to reiterate that I have an open door policy for anyone wishing to speak to me in regards to any issue. This year license to carry or firearms identification card renewal applicants can stop in the station at any time to begin the process of renewing/applying for their LTC/FID. If an Officer is not at the station please call our business line 413-269-0100 and the officer on duty will meet you at the station to assist you.

Finally, I would like to thank all the officers for their continued dedication in providing quality policing to the residents of Otis while maintaining the highest level of professionalism and integrity. I would like to thank the Select Board, Town Administrator, Otis Fire Department, Otis Ambulance, Otis Highway Department, and the Otis Maintenance Department for their dedication and partnership in working together with the Police Department. Furthermore, I would like to thank the residents of Otis for their continued support of the Police Department. Southern Berkshire Regional Emergency Planning Committee SBREPC 2022 Annual Report

The Southern Berkshire Regional Emergency Planning Committee (SBREPC) would like to take this opportunity to thank the Town of Otis for its continued support. The SBREPC works with Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency (MEMA), Berkshire Regional Planning Commission (BRPC) and the Western Region Homeland Security Advisory Council (WRHSAC), along with state and local police, fire services, public health, emergency medical services, and other disciplines in the twelve towns of South Berkshire County.

SBREPC holds monthly meetings at the Great Barrington Fire Station on the 4th Tuesday of each month at 8:00 AM. While it is important to have representation from all the disciplines, Selectboard members are especially encouraged to attend since it is the Local Elected Officials that will have the authority to designate resources in the case of an emergency. Participation in the SBREPC fulfills your town's obligation to belong to a LEPC or REPC and assures you are meeting the goals and missions of SARA Title III.

During FY22, the SBREPC has completed the following:

- Through a grant, coordinated with ambulance and first responder services regarding EMS response, dispatch protocols, and coverage issues.
- Helped to coordinate and obtain information for the update of the EMS Zone Service Plan, which is required by the State.
- Coordinated requests and delivered personal protective equipment for first responders and other organizations.
- Applied for and obtained grants for regional response equipment and training, including upcoming Rescue Task Force training.
- Continued to update the Regional Shelter Plan. This included surveying each town's emergency shelters. Inventoried the shelter equipment container located at Simon's Rock College.
- Updated contact lists for towns and organizations in the region

We are geared up for a busy FY23 as we continue to work to expand resources available to our towns during all hazards. Thank you for your support and involvement to strengthen emergency preparedness in Berkshire County.





Highway Department 2022 Annual Report

Surprisingly with the ongoing struggle to keep and or hire new experienced staff we were able to get quite a bit accomplished this past year, along with our normal workload. We replaced culverts, reclaimed and paved the following roads this year. Judd, Merritt, Dimmock, Ed Jones, and a section of Algerie Rd. have been in extremely poor condition for some time now. Work on Reservoir Rd. near the Marina had also taken place which includes tree canopy removal and culvert replacement to prepare for reconstruction this spring.

Thank you to the previous crew and my new crew Bob, John, and Jeremy for their hard work and dedication in keeping our town roads safe for you the residents. I would like to thank our Building Maintenance and WWTP Supervisor for their assistance throughout the year when needed. The Maintenance Department is responsible for maintaining all Town buildings and grounds, five cemeteries and operating the Transfer station.

Projects completed this fiscal year include

- Drainage and prep work for the new asphalt of the Interior painting Town Hall parking lot as well as the final grading
- Interior painting at the Center Fire House
- Filled the drainage trough with concrete at the Center Fire House
- Poured 2 concrete pads at the Transfer Station
- Facilitated the purchase of a new Kubota tractor from a MassDot Shared Streets Grant.
- Facilitated the purchase of a new 2022 Ford F350 Maintenance Truck

The landscape of the Transfer Station has changed a little over the past year. We moved a few things around to make things flow a little better. There are also a few new things to reduce the items going into the waste stream. We added a new Textile Bin and a Mattress Recycling container to comply with the waste bans that went into effect November 1st. We also added bins to recycle used books and a donation shed. Wastewater Treatment Plant 2022 Annual Report

The wastewater staffs primary responsibility is to collect, pump, and treat raw sewage for those on the municipal sewer system. The plant ran well in 2022 producing quality effluent without any permit violations.

Our wastewater system operates like a normal sewer system, taking waste liquids from your toilet, sink, shower, bath, dishwasher and washing machine and transferring it to the sewer system and treatment plant. In order to properly maintain the system by avoiding blockages and damage to your grinder pump, the following items should NOT be placed into the system in any way:

- *Glass, *Metal, *Plastic, *Kitty litter, *Flammable materials
- *Abrasive materials including gravel, sand, aquarium stone, and coffee grinds
- *Socks, rags, or cloths, *Sanitary napkins or tampons, *Disposable diapers, *Personal wipes,
- *Lubricating oil, grease, paint, large amounts of cooking oil, *Strong chemicals

Building Department 2022 Annual Report

Two-Thousand and Twenty-Two started in the same way as the previous year, with high demand for permits, builders and materials. During the year as interest rates increased and local supply of housing for sale decreased, calls for new building also declined. A difference of thirty-one permits from the prior year speaks to a change in the kinds of work that is being completed in town this past year.

One-hundred and One building permits with a recorded value of \$6,65,852.00 were issued in 2022. There were four new construction permits on previously undeveloped lots with a value of \$651,393.00. Two of these were for non-dwelling consruction with full board of health compliance and lower construction values. There are four new homes on, non-conforming lots, that required demolition of existing structures prior to start. The value of these homes is \$2,000,000.00.

There were 16 – Weatherization permits for insulation, air-sealing, and general tightening of the building envelope to reduce homeowner energy costs. These were at an average cost of \$3,600.00. There were 19 re-roofing permits and 5 accessory structure permits. There were 13-PV Solar permits issued with \$605,530.00 dollar value and an average cost of \$46,000.00. Three of these solar permits included battery storage units for emergency back up power. Necessary alterations and repairs make up the rest of the permits issued. Deck repairs or upgrades, window and door replacement, foundation repair, dormer additions and interior alterations are all included.

The Building Department page on the town's website, <u>townofotisma.com</u> is a place to look for information about building permits and applications, the Town's Zoning By-law, office hours, links to the State Building Code and other forms and documents. Online payment for building permits is now available through the town website.

If you don't see what you're looking for or have a suggestion, click on my name, Larry Gould, and send me an email, or call or text. I am happy to help with your building and zoning questions and welcome your comments.

The office of the building inspector can provide information and direction before any project begins; saving lost time and expense.

Otis Library 2022 Annual Report

We opened the Otis Library with caution this year. Gradually moving from restrictions and regulations. This year we have conducted over 11,500 transactions by our 1250 patrons and many guests. We welcome all this activity. We love sharing our 11653 items with everyone. With our membership in CWMARS (Central & Western Massachusetts Automated Resource System) we shared about 3600 items with libraries throughout Massachusetts. This data tells us that the library has survived the restrictions and precautions of COVID and we are moving on.

This year we had the opportunity to dream and imagine. We participated in the MBLC Small Library Pilot project. This was a competitive grant project that entailed designing a new library which would be 75% funded and constructed by the Massachusetts Library Construction Program. This year long process afforded us the opportunity to look at what we had and what we needed. Although our application was not chosen, we learned much. The library is supported by most people in the community, there is a need for more community involvement in library activities and programs, there is a need for a larger more modern space for all our library materials. We thank everyone who participated in this project, and we invite everyone to continue to dream and imagine as we move on to pursue different avenues of support for a new library. The efforts will continue through subcommittee work chaired by Trustee Sue Brofman.

This year we worked closely with the Farmington River School District to expand the teaching and learning opportunities of Diversity. With a grant award from the American Library Association and matching funds from the Otis Cultural Council we were able to provide teachers materials of their choosing to add experiences in Diversity. Over 100 items were added to the libraries. Also, this grant funded two adult community reads.

Under the direction of our talented and creative trustees, Susan Ebitz and Donna Rich the Otis Library hosts a monthly Story Walk. This is a family event for reading and following a path through nature of the Knox Trail area behind the library. In addition to one public event scheduled the story walk is available for individual family use throughout the posted month.

The Otis Cultural Council generously supported several efforts for the library this year. They purchased a new laminator for the library story walks and other programs, they hosted a Musical event and a Pottery Demonstration for the Library's annual craft fair, and they sponsored a Ukulele Workshop. These events while funded by the Otis Cultural Council add to our list of Library Offerings. This year the Otis Library also funded the ImageArena workshop, encouraging young children in building, creativity, and teamwork.

The annual Campaign generates the extra funding needed for these programs as well as funding for materials. Books, videos, and audiobooks are funded mostly from the stipend that is provided by the town budget. During the COVID restricted years there were no library fines applied to materials that were late. In view of the financial support from the annual campaign and the donations that patrons drop from time to time, there will be no late fines collected at the desk. Only replacement costs will be implemented.

The biggest asset of any organization is the people. So many people have worked hard to maintain and raise the standards and services of the Otis Library. We are also starting a Friends of the Otis Library Program. This will be a volunteer group that will Advocate for the library by working for additional materials, programs, and for special projects.

Last but certainly not least I say goodbye to this position as Director of the Otis Library. It is time for me to retire. I know that the staff and the trustees are fully committed to meeting the needs of the patrons and the community. I look forward to watching this library move forward to reach its fullest potential.

Cultural Council 2022 Annual Report

2022 was a much more active year, culturally speaking, than the previous 2 years. Covid fears and restrictions were reduced, and we were able to again support programs in keeping with our mission to bring cultural access and education in the arts, humanities, and interpretive sciences.

Overall, we received 43 applications for funds - of which we approved 28. We prioritize grants in four categories: youth programs (at the Farmington River Elementary School and programs in Lee and Great Barrington where our students are enrolled; workshops for adults in town; performances by musicians, artists and a potter; and donations to programs in nearby towns that are attended by Otis residents.

Another part of our mission is to promote communication and community-building in town. With that in mind, we are pleased to support events for the Otis Library and collaborate with Amvets in the deposit-bottle & cans recycling effort at the transfer station. Our team of volunteer recyclers has enabled us to purchase equipment for the school and library that will make cultural programming better and more accessible.

Last but not least, we continue to support the Beautify Otis effort with the purchase of barrels and flowers for our volunteer gardeners. Thanks to them, and to all those who support us throughout the year.

Historic Commission 2022 Annual Report

This has been an exciting year for the Otis Historical Commission. We have accomplished much this past year, although much more still needs to be done. The Knox Trail is being maintained by the Knox Trail Snow Riders and as usual special thanks to Tom Ragusa who has made recognition of the KT his life's work.

The East Otis Schoolhouse is now listed on the National Historic Register. The first phase of construction is almost completed. LaRochelle Construction was engaged to move the

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schoolhouse, install steel beams to support it, and return it to its original location. The schoolhouse is one of the last remaining one room schoolhouses in the Berkshires. When completed it will look much as it did when last in session - the 1940's.

Plans for renovating and repurposing the newly named Otis Cultural Center at Historic St Paul's are underway. A survey of the town clearly indicated that the townspeople would like it used for cultural events. We received an emergency grant of \$100,000 from the Mass Historical Commission, which was given in person by Secretary of State Galvin. The Otis Cultural Center is located in the newly designated Otis Center Historic District.

The Otis Preservation Trust has raised more than \$500,000 to support OHC's planned restoration of the Cultural Center and the East Otis Schoolhouse. The Otis Preservation Trust (OPT) has received donations from more than 385 individuals, and with OHC has received funding from 4 foundations. Our grant writing team continues to submit applications for additional grants for OPT and OHC. Special thanks to Gail Gelburd with the important assistance of Lynne Geane and Celeste Watman. We'd like to thank the Board of Directors of the Otis Preservation Trust for making the third year of fundraising a resounding success

The "Notice Otis" Series has been well received. We've learned about ghosts, metal sculpture, paintings and marionettes. Hilary Harley organizes the program and invites artists, performers, or lecturers to present as part of this series. Community outreach has been important. OHC and OPT manned a booth at the farmer's market and got a chance to share our activities with our community. We also manned a booth at the Library Fair and invited Charles Flint to evaluate people's antique treasures.

Several townspeople have begun donating "treasures" of historical significance along with boxes containing articles and photos. Celeste Watman, Lynne Geane, Stephanie Skinner, Tricia Smith, Judi Maybe and Gail Gelburd have been organizing and maintaining these files for future exhibits. Special thanks to Vincent Caruso who created an artistic interpretation of St Paul's which is being utilized on all promotional materials. The OHC honors the memory of Sonia Morrison whose vision, intellect, and love of Otis continues to inspire us.

Conservation Commission 2022 Annual Report

The primary role of the Otis Conservation Commission is to preserve and protect the integrity of the town's wetland systems, while striving to work with and serve the community. With nine designated great ponds, as well as the West Branch of the Farmington River, the Otis Conservation Commission is one the most active conservation commissions in the state.

In 2022, the Commission conducted 136 site inspections; heard 17 Notice of Intents applications (NOIs) & 58 Request for Determination of Applicability applications (RDAs); and issued/resolved 9 Enforcement Orders, 9 Emergency Certifications, 3 extensions of Orders of Conditions and finally, issued 12 certificates of compliance. The Commission also inspected installed erosion controls, for purposes of work commencement, or to ensure that erosion control measures can be removed upon project completion, with most approved filings.

The Commission meets at 6:00 PM, on the third Tuesday of each month. The office hours for the Commission, are the first Wednesday of each month, at 6:00 PM, and the deadline for submission of applications is on the same day as the office hours, for each respective month, by 6:00 PM, no exceptions!

The Commission would like to Thank Bob Mason with MASS DCR (Department of Conservation and Recreation), who has worked in conjunction with the Otis Concom, participating in site visits. The Commission would like to welcome back and thank Mark Stinson from MA DEP; and the Commission would like to thank the community of Otis for respecting, and following the rules and guidelines, as set forth by the regulations of the MA Wetlands Protection Act.

As Chairman I wish to thank my fellow Commissioners as well as our administrative assistant, Kristen Brown. All of whom have served the community consistently for many years.

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Planning Board 2022 Annual Report

The Planning Board is responsible for preparing and maintaining a comprehensive/ master plan (MGL Chapter 41, Section 81D), Propose, review, hold hearings and make recommendations on zoning bylaw / ordinance changes to the Town Protective By-Laws, Review and act on subdivisions – preliminary & definitive plans (MGL c.41, section 81K-81GG), Review and sign Approval Not Required (ANR) plans and is required to review, hold public hearings and make recommendations on proposals that will affect land use. The Planning Board oversees Site Plan Reviews and hears requests from property owners or developers seeking to divide a tract of land, reaffirm boundary lines or create a new subdivision who, must submit surveyed plot plans to the Board for appropriate action as governed by MGL, Chapter 41, Section 81. The Town of Otis requires any new lots in the R-1 residential district to be a minimum of one (1) acre, have 150 feet of road frontage on an approved road or way and provide adequate access for emergency and vehicular traffic. In the Village V-1 district lot area shall not be less than 20,000 square feet and the frontage shall not less than 60'. The Planning Board oversees, reviews, and recommends new or updates to existing Bylaws. We are currently working on updating the Towns' existing Wireless Communication Facilities Bylaw and are proposing a Short Term Rental Bylaw. The Planning Board submits all proposed or changes to existing bylaws to the Select Board for their review & comments with the final draft presented at Town Meeting for adoption by public vote. The Planning Board has received Planning Grants that are sponsored & funded by both Massachusetts and Federal agencies. These planning studies include: the Municipal Vulnerability Planning (MVP), Hazard Mitigation Planning (HMP) and Complete Streets Planning. The Otis Complete Streets Planning Report is complete, identifying many potential infrastructure improvement projects large and small. The Town has been granted over \$200,000 for some of the smaller projects in the first round of complete streets project funding and we are well positioned to receive much more funding for the larger projects that were identified. The results of these studies are incorporated into the Towns' Master Plan. The Planning Board continues to work with all of the Towns' Boards and Committees, Berkshire Regional Planning Commission and other Local, State and Federal Agencies on projects such as Otis Sewer district, Community Development, Community Preservation, Historical Preservation, Building Use, MVP, HMP, Complete Streets and continues seeking and applying for Grant opportunities. The Planning Board meets on the second Monday of every month at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall. (Postings of meetings and/or date/time change in the event there is a conflict with a legal holiday.) The Board welcomes property owners with questions concerning the required procedures to subdivide their land under the laws.

Zoning Board of Appeals 2022 Annual Report

The Town of Otis, Zoning Board of Appeals consists of five (5) members and two (2) associate members appointed by the Board of Selectmen as provided in Section 12, Chapter 40A of the Massachusetts General Laws (MGL).

The Board of Appeals serves as the special permit granting authority for the town. This board also hears and decides upon appeals or petitions for variances. Information and duties are outlined in the Town of Otis Bylaws Section 9.2.

The ZBA meets when applications are received, on the first Monday of each month based on a published schedule available on the town web site. All meetings are posted and open to the public. During 2022, all meetings were held via remote participation over the internet.

During calendar year 2022, the Zoning Board of Appeals heard 5 applications for special permits or variances. 4 were granted and 1 was denied. Of particular value to the town was the approval of a 4th Wireless Cell Tower within Otis just off Rt 23 close to Lion Hill Road that will not only improve wireless service in town but will also provide better emergency and first responder communications among the police, fire and ambulance departments.

We also recommended to the Select Board that we raise the application fees for Special Permit and Variance hearings to \$300 per application to ensure our fees continue to cover all the direct expenses (advertising, postage) associated with reviewing such requests. The Select Board approved said increase.

On the housekeeping side, the ZBA bid farewell to one of our long standing members - Robin Peterson Woomer – and elevated our most senior Associate Member – Wayne Wosczyna – to Full Member. We are hopeful that we will shortly welcome a new Associate Member to ensure we have a full slate of volunteers to meet the Town's needs in 2023

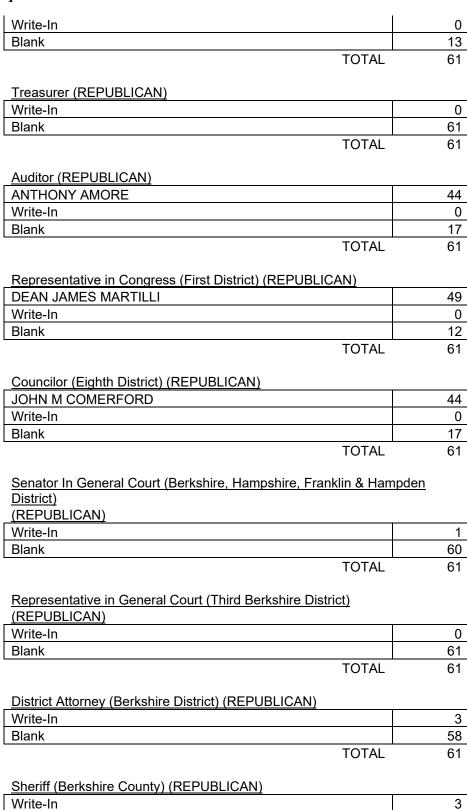

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$70,000 for the purpose of purchasing a truck for the maintenance department, and further to provide for said appropriation, take said sum from Free Cash.

ARTICLE 11: Waste Water/Water Operator Truck

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$35,000 for the purpose of purchasing a truck for the Waste Water/Water Operator, and further to provide for said appropriation, take said sum from Free Cash-

A motion was made to accept Article 11.

The motion was seconded.

Discussion: Didn't we buy a new highway truck last year and transfer the old one to Waste Water? Brandi explained we did purchase a new highway truck and just took possession of it 2 months ago. Keith has been using the old waste water truck and he just took possession of the old highway truck. Both of those trucks are in such bad repair that they will both go to surplus. Article 11 passed unanimously.

ARTICLE 12: Fire Proof File Cabinet

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for the purpose of purchasing the Town Clerk a fire proof file cabinet, and further to provide for said appropriation, take said sum from Free Cash.

A motion was made to accept Article 12.

This should apply to setting the agendas for future meetings as well."

This article is not supported by the Selectboard

A motion was made to accept Article 15.

The motion was seconded.

Discussion: What does prevailing mean? One member from the other town needs to be part of the majority. Therese Gould explained the Selectboard does not support this because the school committee is to represent the school and the children in it. They are not elected to represent the town.

Jessica Drenga, School Committee member, stated the issue is based on population and Otis has 4 members and Sandisfield has 3. A voter added the towns agreed on this 25 years ago based on population.

Carol Lombardo, School Committee Chair, expressed her concerns and hope for the School Committees from both towns to work together for the best interest of the school.

Article 15 failed; defeated unanimously.

ARTICLE 16: Resolution In Support of the Fair Share Amendment

To see if the Town will vote to support the following petition;

WHEREAS, In June of 2021, with a vote of 159 in favor and 4l opposed, the Massachusetts Legislature's Constitutional Convention voted to place the Fair Share Amendment on the November, 2022 state wide ballot; and

WHEREAS, To help all families and build a stronger economy for everyone, we must have quality public education, including our public colleges and universities; and safe and reliable public transportation infrastructure; and

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WHEREAS, We must make long term investments in public education to help students academically, socially, and emotionally, especially in light of the Covid-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, We must reduce tuition and fees charged in our public education institutions in order to make higher education affordable and reduce student debt; and

WHEREAS, We have a backlog of neglected and substantially impaired public transportation infrastructure in need of repair and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, We must have safe, modern, and reliable public transportation infrastructure including roads, bridges, trains, buses, and trail ways for biking and walking; and

WHEREAS, Additional state revenue is needed to improve public schools, Pre-K through 12, and make higher public education more affordable, and reinvest in our public transportation infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, Even before the Covid-19 pandemic, Massachusetts needed additional investment in public education and transportation infrastructure to ensure a more equitable and long lasting economy for everyone; and

WHEREAS, Our highest income residents pay a lower share of their income in state and local taxes than the majority of taxpayers;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That during the 2022 Otis Annual Town Meeting residents of Otis discuss and show support for the adoption of the proposed Fair Share Amendment that would create an additional tax of four percentage points on annual income above one million dollars and dedicate these funds raised by this tax for quality public education and affordable public colleges and universities, and for the repair and maintenance of public roads, bridges and public transportation.

A motion was made to accept Article 16 as published in the warrant.

The motion was seconded.

Article 16 passed, 9 opposed.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded. The meeting adjourned at 7:35 pm.

Notes: The PTO became the PTA, with national membership and affiliations as a not for profit organization, very active in many aspects of the District. The PTA provided information on school events to all District parents. They arranged for Room Parents for all classrooms. The PTA held many creative fund-raising activities, such as the Cash Calendars, to raise funds for school equipment and opportunities (smart boards, classroom materials, field trips, and in-school programs, etc.). PTA members also helped with Field Day, the Holiday Shoppe, and other family events. They contributed tens of thousands of dollars to the students' education, enrichment, and recreation opportunities that could not be accommodated in the regular school budget.

P. FRRSD Volunteers and Collaborations:

Notes: The District students benefited from many family and community volunteers who spent time in the classrooms and at the Otis Library working with children and doing projects with them. The Otis Cultural Council and the Sandisfield Cultural Council again donated hundreds of dollars to the school for in-school enrichment programs and field trips. These volunteers served to enhance student learning and enrichment.

Q. Collaboration with District Police and Fire Departments:

Notes: Otis and Sandisfield Police and Fire Chiefs, along with staff members form their respective departments, worked closely with the School Administration to develop a lock-down procedure and to work with State Police in the training of all staff members and parents in lock-down and shelter-in-place procedures. Our lock-down drills continued to be successful because of the partnership.

During the April Vacation, the Otis Police Department provided an opportunity to allow children to interact with law enforcement officers in a proactive, positive manner while doing some very interesting and fun activities.

R. Use of District Facilities:

Notes: The District facilities are available to both Towns that comprise the District. The Otis Fire Department utilizes
the school for training purposes, and the Kiwanis Club's annual Pancake Breakfast for Veteran's Day is here in
the cafeteria.

Board of Assessors 2022 Annual Report

The Board of Assessors, along with our assessing staff provided under contract by Regional Resource Group, continue to assure the fair taxation of all Otis properties. This summer we welcomed Candy Chaffee to the office as our new Clerk. This year the department reviewed 64 building permits, which included new dwellings, additions, renovations, decks, residential solar electricity generation systems, structure demolition, etc. We recorded approximately 155 real estate transfers. At the Tax Classification Hearing in December, we reported \$804,403,198 in total values. This was an increase of \$105,384,197 from the year before. The average valuation increased from \$366,200 to \$426,300.

During the past year, we reorganized and updated assessment records. Other efforts included inspecting property after building permits are processed and auditing property files for accuracy and completeness. There is a 10-year cyclical inspection program in place, resulting in on-going property inspections.

As the town's principal revenue generator, the Assessors are constantly on the lookout for properties subject to taxation. We seek to enhance tax revenues by: identifying second homeowners whose household furnishings are subject to taxation; along with businesses that have inventory or fixtures that may be taxable, that property given a certificate of occupancy is taxed at the fully assessed value, reviewing prior years' deeds to assure verify current property values, monitoring individual assessments to insure that abatements are kept to a minimum and assuring that all requests for abatements are reasonable and properly processed. We have added several parcels to the Personal Property tax records that had previously not been inventoried making sure that new construction is monitored and assessed.

Other office activities included: photographing structures and attaching those photos to computerized assessment records, processing land divisions, reviewing and processing abatement requests, processing personal property forms and chapter land applications and preparing various Department of Revenue reports. 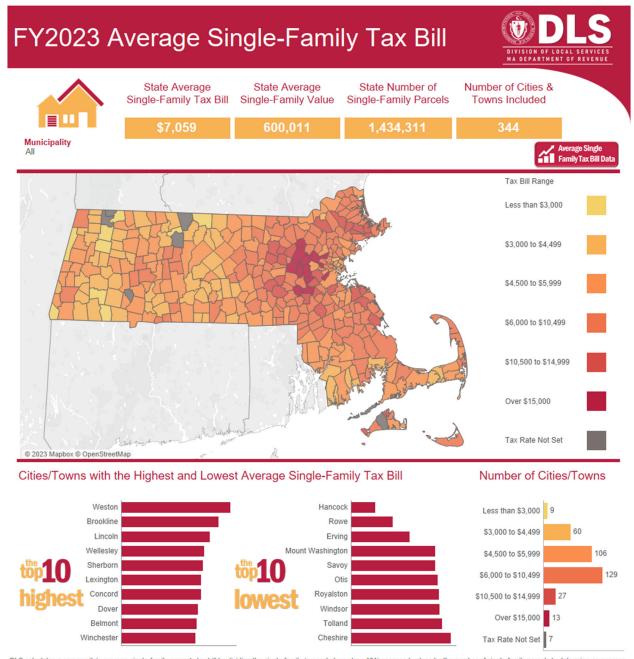
The Finance Board is committed to represent the taxpayers of our town so that Otis continues to move forward in a fiscally sound manner.

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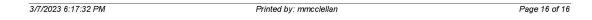
